






Front view (sectioned B-B')




Cross section A-A'

Side view (sectioned C-C')





3d re-constructive models using Rhinoceros + VRay



The project partecipated to the competition for the expansion of the "Camera dei deputati" ail of the Rome's parliament building. The project didn't went throught many phases of the competition and therefore only has a few general drawings and no executive plan.

The architect proposed a strong provocation, being in the city centre, and we had to understand how it was supposed to structurally and architecturally work, plus redesigning it and model with the aid of computer programs.


To reinforce this concept we created the main axis, which cuts into our area, and is the fast way for people who just need to cross the place. which was earlier enclose by high walls.

THEME: "Der letzte Weg" - expansion of a small multy-faith graveyard
















The interpretation of a graveyard changes a lot, the perception one can have about it varies mainly with religion, but as well, with culture, personal life, experiences and so on.


The approach I've had in designing it, was to create a place where staying wouldn't make people feel bad, but a place where would be made easy to go over everything: a peacefull place.

A way is not necessary circular, nor leading to an end. My conception was to create a central core, a linear core where people could share experience and talk, a path of distribution among all the different enclosures where the graves are really located.

THEME: requalification of an abandoned area to be turned into a centre for start-ups and exhibitions









The area of the project is in the heart of Frankfurt, in the Bahnhofsviertel.

Neighborood renowned for problems releated to drugs and safety. On the other side is as well a changing community, new people are moving to live here, young people, artists as well, and with them the opportunity to shape a new identity for the area.

The necessity to create a space accesible to everybody turned into the design's concept: the ramp, a spiral way-up, located in the centre of the bulding, is working both as connective element as much as functional, because, being so wide, turns into the exhibition space itself.



The Appia Antica park runs along the old Appia Antica, a ancient Roman street, sourranded by archeological sites and important historical buildings. In the last century this park has been exploited and victim of illegal private constructions. We've been working on the mapping of the archeological heritage and the private illegal housing, in order to analyse problems first and then find a development key of what is one of the most valuable sites in Rome.
